At that time, it was only possible to rescue and repair the main section of the cemetery and extended work was still needed to complete the project. Since then, the vaad and family didn't give up and persevered with constant intervention to extend the fencing around all sections of the cemetery. Finally, this week, local authorities granted permission to fence in the entire cemetery. Family members are elated and eager to complete the fencing and thus fully secure the holy resting place.

Back in 2000, the Vaad HaRabunim and the descendants of Seňa, Slovakia, started working on restoring the beis hachaim in the shtetel of their ancestors, giving the impetus to the subsequent founding of HFPJC-Avoyseinu. Ten years later, in 2010, Avoyseinu broadened the scope of its work to include scores of neglected batei chaim from other cities across Europe, and launched a weekly newsletter titled Avoyseinu Bulletin, featuring constant updates about the organization's multitude of projects. This week, Parshas Shemos, 20 years and 500 bulletins later, it is only fitting that we fervently proclaim: "Baruch Shehechiyanu V'Kiymanu..." and "Baruch Hatov V'hameitiv...".

Avoyseinu Bulletin, which adorns the walls of hundreds of shuls and is being emailed to thousands of recipients worldwide, mirrors the avodas hakodesh on the ground: The relentless work of restoring batei chaim on the European continent. Avoyseinu has merited receiving many brachos and much praise from leading gedolim and community leaders. Over the past 20 years, Avoyseinu has impacted thousands of extended families in hundreds of cities, and is m'kadesh Shem Shamayim with the mitzvah of chessed shel emes by restoring respect to the deceased in dilapidated cemeteries.

Indeed, the cemetery in Seňa is but a most telling example of Avoyseinu's unique approach to this venerable work, and the amazing siyatta dishmaya the organization sees. When Avoyseinus started working in Seňa, many restrictions limited the scope of what they could do to restore be is hachaim. Giving up was not an option, though. Small steps grew into larger ones, and little by little, the cemetery was restored to its rightful condition, spanning over two decades to achieve that goal.

Our ancestors are meilitz yosher for all participants in Avoyseinu's vital work who take pride in supporting such a praiseworthy cause. As Chazal tell us, chessed shel emes is one of the largest mitzvas- Ashrei Luhem V'ashrei Chelkum! Much bracha will be heaped upon those who participate wholeheartedly in this avodas hakodesh and upon their children and grandchildren.

The weekly Avoyseinu Bulletin has thus merited a trusted place in Shuls all over, with a reader-base of many thousands across the spectrum of Yiddishkeit, as we are all invested with these activities and updates.
