Problems:

A few iron pillars were stolen but the fence is standing all right. According to Steiner there are 200 stones, but our evaluater thinks there might ne up to 500 in very bad shape - it can't be seen b/c the cem is so overgrown. Trees/forest need to be cut but very carefully not to demage the stones. Per Steiner, wire fence is 400 m. Further analysis of maps will verify this. two sides of the cemetery are surrounded with a ditch, so here the borders are quite apparent. But on the other two sides it's not so clear. Indergrowth needs to be cut asap.
