Problems:

Highly recommended to fence around the remaining part of the Jewish cemetery.

According to the old map half of the cemetery is missing from today's lot. The condition of the Jewish cemetery is bad, fully overgrown with acacias. The gravestones are mostly toppled/under the ground. Since the Non-Jewish part is close to the end of it's capacity (there's place for 80-100 new graves), there's a high risk of taking away the part of the Jewish cemetery. The last Non-Jewish grave is extremely close to the first Jewish gravestone.
